1.10. Project Summary

The EASY CONNECTING Project has been thought and developed with the specific goals of boosting cooperation activities across the IPA area to find common solutions to the challenges of improving freight transport infrastructures and services. The Project wants to fulfill an implement on the ground the new European transport policies and recommendations (TEN-T Guidelines, 2011 White Paper on Transport) by focusing on the main freight transport corridors and their effective management including all the key stakeholders, by incentivizing the role of ports and logistic platforms towards the deployment of more efficient, safety and environmental solutions. Furthermore EASY CONNECTING could be an experimental tool to support the new Adriatic and Ionian Macroregion by stimulating the discussion and provide recommendations on the key transport and logistic priorities to be pursued in the next programming period. Policy makers, public and private stakeholders are the main beneficiaries. Concerning the partnership, the Project has tried to involve all the countries involved in the IPA Adriatic Cross-border Cooperation Programme in order to ensure the wider spread of the project's results. The Project will be led by the Veneto Region due to its strong and long experience in cooperation projects. The Partners selected have very different nature and roles and they represent the academic world, the public and private sectors bringing very specific competencies and know-how within the consortium. This would allow toform a sort of cluster for sharing information and expertise. In practical terms the project has 16 partners from 7 different countries: Italy – the

Veneto Region, Institute for Transport and Logistic, Abruzzo Region, Marche Region, Chambers of Commerce of Campobasso, Italian Coast Guard, Port Authorities of Venezia, Ravenna and Levante; Slovenia: Chambers of Commerce of Primorska; Croatia: Dubrovnik Neretva Region; Serbia: Alma Mons and Chambers of Commerce of Serbia; Montenegro: The Ministry of Transport of Montenegro; Bosnia: University of Sarajevo Greece: Port of Corfù. Moreover there are 9 associated partners from 3 different countries.

In terms of activities the project has been divided in 7 main work packages that are instrumental to find new and innovative solutions for addressing the key challenges of better environmental performance, more efficient and fast transport services, more qualified and skillful operators and a more interconnected and functional transport network.

- 1. WP1 –Management and coordination: for the effective and smooth management of the project and implmenetation of the project's activities. All partners are involved
- 2. WP2 –Communication and dissemination: for the wider dissemination and communication concerning the objectives, challenges and achievements of the project. All partners are involved
- 3. WP3 –Capitalization and sustainability: for the capitalization all the previous experiences of the partners and for the long-lasting sustainability of the project's results. All partners involved
- 4. WP4 –Enhancement and integration of multimodal freight transport solutions in the IPA area: for analyzing and developing common solutions to improve multimodal freight transport solutions based on clear studies, surveys and analysis on the bottlenecks and needs of the IPA area
- 5. WP5 –Capacity Building and improvement of competences: for improving the knowledge and skills in the IPA area of public authorities and private and public operators
- 6. WP6 –Stimulating and improving ports info standards: to harmonize port maritime service based on common ICT technologies in order to improve and accelerate the safety, security and mobility of freights between ports
- 7. WP7 Pilot Project for the development of Intermodal centres in the PAO Area: for some concrete pilot initiatives aiming to develop intermodal logistic platforms. Few specific pilot projects will be developed and tested

3. Project Description

3.1. Project background and the problems and/or challenges to be addressed

The development of more efficient and sustainable transports is one of the crucial components of the EUROPE 2020 strategy and one of the pillars of both the new TEN-T Guidelines and the White Paper on transport. The new TEN-T Methodology envisages few core network transport corridors, which have to foster multimodality, the deployment of renewable energies & clean fuels, capable of connecting the main transport nodes (ports, cities, logistics platforms, airports). This is in line with the overarching objective of deploying more competitive & efficient freight transport, which is essential to spur economic development in Europe and fulfil the objectives of the Lisbon Strategy on competitiveness & employment. These issues are at the core of future developments of the whole Adriatic area where too many disparities and structural weaknesses remain between different States and Regions. The recent launch of the new maritime strategy for the Adriatic & Ionian Seas underlines the need to step up cooperation in the area by exploiting existing resources, structures & regulations to foster cross-border partnerships and mobilize local, regional and national actors towards common objectives. "Optimizing transport links by developing an integrated, demand-based, low-carbon maritime transportation network across the Region" & "stimulating the creations of maritime clusters" are two of the main priorities of the strategy. More interconnections, links & exchange of good practices are indeed fundamental between the two coasts of the Adriatic sea where many initiatives exist due to individual approaches and not yet based on a common and consistent policy. Moreover the development of an effective transport policy based on the new TEN-T Guidelines is jeopardized by the lack of infrastructures & services based on multimodal solutions. The road freight transport still plays a major role and rail and inland navigation are not sufficiently exploited. Accessibility analysis shows that railway has travel times much longer than the respective roads' ones. Ports are often not well connected to the transport network and logistic centers. Existing inter-modal terminals are still underutilized. However, there is a great potential for enhancing inter-modal transport with an envisaged increase of 15% by 2015 in the sole core network. Furthermore the very fragile Adriatic ecosystem, both marine and coastal, have to be protected and taken carefully into consideration by deploying more eco-friendly means of transport together with eco-innovative services. The Easy Connecting Project aims at studying and analysing all the main infrastructural bottlenecks and transport service inefficiencies in the IPA area in order to find&test proper solutions and put forward recommendations for policy-makers and national/regional representatives. These propositions are essential to develop a common strategy on transport and logistics ensuring the common development of the area in the near future.

3.2. Project Objectives (general and specific)

The general Objective of priority 3 is to promote the coordination between private and public actors offering transport services for a better management of the multi-modal freight transport solutions. The Easy Connecting project aims specifically at engaging public actors (at three different levels: local, regional and national authorities) and private entities (e.g. chambers of commerce, operators and the business community) to define & test common IPA initiatives on innovative freight multimodal solutions.. The further objectives of supporting efficient connection of the sea transport modes with the hinterland and cross-border areas, supporting the integration of national and regional strategies, are also strongly pursued by the project by trying to make port authorities, together with the competent authorities, working together in order to harmonize & develop a coherent and comprehensive integrated freight transport system based on innovative ICT solutions. The project fulfils all the compulsory specific objectives of the call. In particular the objective of integrating and upgrading existing multimodal freight transport services through an in-depth analysis of the bottlenecks/shortcomings is the core activity of WP 4. A thorough study on the main bottlenecks & weaknesses affecting the development of freight transport polices will be the starting point of the project activities based also on past experiences and lessons learnt. Furthermore all the data concerning the flow of freight and goods, the O/D matrixes, will be assessed. The results of the study/survey with business cases will be a set of common guidelines on the possible solutions for more efficient & sustainable means of transport for freight based on multi-modal choices. Subsequently these guidelines will be discussed & they will form the basis for cross borders cooperation agreements for harmonized freight transport policies &services. The second objective of developing new and modernize existing multimodal physical infrastructure is realized through a series of studies & market based analyses on the current limitations of the transport network and the investments needed to overcome these bottlenecks. A specific attention will be given to micro-investments in port infrastructures in order to verify the potential development of Adriatic ports for freight transport services. The third compulsory objective of stimulating institutional cooperation and capacity building through the exchange of know-how and experiences will also be completely fulfilled by the project activities. WP 3 and WP5 focus specifically on the exchange of best practices, techniques and know-how from previous experiences gained through other cooperation programmes and partners' initiatives. This knowledge will be shared among all the partners through the signing of MoUs and they will be disseminated through ad hoc seminars and conferences foreseen in the Project with the objective of mainstreaming its results.

3.3. Coherence of the project

3.3.1. Coherence of the project with the Programme's strategy

The key element of the Easy Connecting project is a close cooperation that effectively aims at strengthening and integrating transport networks in the IPA area by overcoming bottlenecks/barriers due to the lack of transnational coordinated transport policies on freight transport across borders. The final goal is to develop an holistic strategy for freight transports for the whole Adriatic Region (Italian and Balkans coast) based on multimodal solutions encouraging, above all, the growth of more sustainable transports modes and more efficient transport services also based on innovative ICT technologies. The project in perfectly in line with the overarching objective of the Adriatic IPA cross border co-operation programme which aims at strengthening sustainable development and capabilities in the Adriatic Region through a concerted strategy of action between the partners of the eligible territories. The EASYCONNECTING Project supports the set up of transport networks, with a specific focus on the relationships between ports and their respective hinterland, and logistic platforms for the better management of freight distribution. This overall goal is instrumental to other related fundamental objectives uphold by the IPA Programme itself such as fostering sustainable economic growth, to improve the quality of life in maritime border Regions and to promote social cohesion and co-operation. By better planning investments in transport facilities and services but also in capacity building activities for both public and private transport and logistic operators the very scope of the IPA Adriatic Programme and, more generally, of the Gothenburg/Lisbon strategy are uphold and put into practice. These co-operation activities will be up-hold by ad-hoc agreements between the project partners.

To better summarize, the project does not just focus on the sectorial and very specific analysis of the current weaknesses and deficiencies in the transport network and logistic services. Easy Connecting wants also to address other crucial aspects that the are the cornerstones of an efficient and long-term sustainable transport policy such as highly skilled operators, less burocratic and much faster administrative processes managed by more competent responsible authorities, a stronger attention to environmental needs in order to avoid issues such as CO2 emissions and air pollution. In particular the latter aspect, more environmental friendly and less polluting freight transport, is the key parameters through which all the solutions and recommendations put forward will be assessed and evaluated during the project. This reflects the objective of the Gothenburg strategy and the Europe 2020 aiming at creating a more smart, sustainable and inclusive economy.

3.3.3. Coherence of the project with public national and subnational strategies

The Adriatic Eastern Countries (PAO) have adopted the guidelines released by the High Level Group (HLG) in November 2005 aiming at the harmonization of transport policies, the consistency with global standards and international conventions. In order to fully implement the Acquis Communautaire, they promote the exchange of best practices for the better integration and efficient connections of the sea transports with the hinterland and cross-borders areas. Furthermore the 2004 MoU for the development of the Core Regional Transport Network – signed by Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Montenegro, Serbia and Kosovo and the United Nations Mission in Kosovo and the European Commission – aims at implementing a multimodal network which includes road, rail and inland waterway links together with a number of designated sea ports, river ports and airports. The goal is also to connect major regional cities, to provide access to Core Network ports (and airports) and to ensure that remote areas of the region are adequately served.

In Italy the National Logistic Plan for 2011-2020 details the policy actions to be followed at national, regional and local level in order to deliver a competitive and efficient transport and logistics national system. This new plan sets the following priorities:

- 1. The development of sea and railways connections for long-runner transport. In particular sea shipping through the Motorways of the Sea or short shipping routes (also ro/ro services) shall be further exploited in order to make Italy the first operator in Europe:
- 2. Better connections between ports and retro-ports based on innovative actions/solutions with an increasing use of rail services within ports.
- 3. Developing an European Logistic freight transport plan action and deploying smarter and environmental friendly modes of transport.
- 4. To divide the Italian territory in several macro-logistic areas (Logistic Platforms) in order to develop a new organization model capable of delivering accessibility to the transport network, to maximize the infrastructure and its management through integrated services and to maximise the potential and capabilities of each macro-area.

Furthermore, analysing the transnational dimension, the NAPA Association (North Adriatic Port Association including the ports of Venice, Trieste, Koper and Rijeka) has been created in with the ambitious goal of sharing standards and procedures and promoting the Northern Adriatic route as an alternative to the North-European ports. In addition, the association anticipates cooperation in the development of maritime and hinterland connections, environmental protection, safety and information technology. The EASY CONNECTING project reflects the vision and ultimate objectives of these national/regional policies and it analyses the loopholes and room or improvement of these policy instruments.

3.4. Added value of the cross-border coopperation in this project

The EASY CONNECTING project is necessary for the consistent and coherent development of the transport network in the countries involved since they face common challenges and issues and only common solutions could provide a true benefit for each territory. Furthermore the project will continue the work already carried out through other initiatives between these territories, therefore it provides an opportunity to capitalize past experiences in order to consolidate the integration and harmonization of transport policy in the whole area directly addressed. The cross-border partnership and collaboration is also crucial for the exchange of up-to-date data concerning the transportof freights, the exchange of innovative techniques and good practices, the identification and test of common approaches and solutions, the finalization of guidelines and recommendations that can address cross-borders bottlenecks and missing links affecting the flow of goods among the countries involved. The partners involved in the project have expressed many times the intention and willingness to

cooperate together by sharing different expertise and experiences that can bring mutual benefit for all the partners. These cross cooperation is also instrumental to the Adriatic Ionian Macroregion initiative and can provide some concrete inputs on how to structure and organize the work in the next multi-annual period. Furthermore many of the areas involved are also part of the Danube Region strategy and through the project it would be possible to find interactions and collaborations between these two fundamental strategies. Finally the cross-border cooperation is called by the nature of the project key themes, as freight transport operates and relies on the supranational level, thus the answers to freight transport improvement cannot be placed a mere regional and national level but need cross-border business an policy cooperation.

3.5. Methodology approach

The Project is structured in 7 different work packages that are closely interconnected. WP1 will ensure a close coordination and efficient management of the project by engaging all the partners in the project activities. WP 2 relates to the communication activities that are crucial for the wide dissemination of the results. WP3 focuses on the capitalization of all the past experiences and projects that the partners have been involved in concerning freight transport issues. Data on the flow of freights will be collected and shared. WP4 will continue the work by specifically analysing which are the most efficient and feasible multimodal freight transport solutions based on the needs already highlighted in WP3. WP5 will focus on the capacity building component by trying to enhance skills of public and private stakeholders working in the transport sector and logistic chain. The documents developed in WP 3&4 will be essentials for this work. WP6 is specifically dedicated to ICT solutions developed by the port authorities in order to standardize and harmonize ports procedures. WP7 concentrates on pilot projects in order to verify the feasibility of new intermodal centres. The partnership has been built with the rationale of involving various types of stakeholders with different expertise working in freight transport and freight distribution. Public authorities, chambers of commerce, ports, university and private organization both within the partnership and as external beneficiaries will be the main targets of the project activities. The innovative character of the project is given by the very comprehensive and holistic approach: all the different aspects of the transport and logistic chain will be studied, analysed and assessed to innovate and structurally change transport policies and investments in the IPA Region. The environmental, safety, human and economic components of freight transport are to be together developed in order to provide innovative solutions.

3.6. Expected results and outputs

The direct and immediate results of the projects are:

- ¿Increase of knowledge and know how among the partners and external targeted groups involved in the project activities concerning freight transport issues, best practices already carried out in the IPA Region and in other parts of Europe concerning multimodal freight transport solutions
- ¿ Increase technical & financial knowledge among private and public stakeholders on how to plan and manage investments in transport infrastructures and transport services including micro-investments in ICT technologies and ecobonus
- ¿ Concrete policy recommendations available for policy makers and responsible authorities concerning the better integration of the main freight transport nodes and the deployment of multimodal and intermodal freight transport solutions
- ¿ Identification of the main infrastructural works to be undertaken and of possible new maritime freight services
- ¿ Improvement of transport safety, environmental regulations, competences of transport operators
- ¿ Harmonization and enhancedrelations of freight transport in the IPA area
- ¿ Enhancement of the traffic monitoring system and design of integration of ICT technologies in the ports of the IPA Region with the development of an ICT prototype for maritime transport
- ¿ Scouting and business plans for setting up new multi-modal services

3.8.1. How the project will realize one/more of the previous joint cooperation system

The project ensures a high degree of cooperation in all the different aspects. In particular:

Joint development: all the activities, outputs and results have been logically designed by all the project partners. Each project partner has the possibility to bring into the project the issues and characteristics it its regional/local context in order to find common solutions for better freight transport multimodal solution that can be then adapted to each specific scenario.

Joint staffing: the Steering Working Group and the Technical working group are joint structure where all the partners will be represented and they will have the opportunity to closely cooperate for mutual learning purposes. Each partner will have in fact the opportunity to bring its own experience and knowledge within the consortium in order to maximize the cooperation activities

Joint implementation: all the main activities and key outputs are jointly carried out by the partnership so that the project implementation is oriented to the delivery of joint products and, therefore, joint results that will bring concrete benefits for the entire IPA area.

Joint financing: each project partner will have a share of the project's budget according to its role, responsibilities in order to effectively contribute to the implementation and finalization of the project's outputs and results.

Furthermore the project will also ensure a strong cooperation during the entire duration of the project with 9 Partner Associates who will bring also their contribution and capabilities for the improvement of the project's deliverables and their wider dissemination across the IPA Region.

3.9. Project management

The Project envisages a very clear governance structure based on a joint coordination and management process and a strong supervision by the Lead Beneficiary. Each partner will be responsible to set up local project teams and to appoint a Local Project Manager right after the signature of the partnership agreement who will be responsible for the day-to-day management of the project at local level. He/she will constantly inform and update the Project Coordinator of the LB about any issues or challenges faced during the implementation of the activities and concerning the status of the work. He/she will also be involved in the Steering meeting group in order to participate to all the decisions concerning the implementations of the project and the approval of the project deliverables. The Steering working group is, in fact, the decision-making body of the project and it is responsible for the smooth, timing and effective implementation of the project

activities. It will coordinate and monitor the work of the local project teams. The Group will meet on a six months basis and then it will regularly be in touch through the internal communication channels such as call/video conferences and the Easy Connecting website. Each Partner will also be responsible to assign a technical expert and financial manager in order to support the local project manager in all the technical/operative/administrative and financial activities foreseen by the project. The technical experts will participate to the Technical working group responsible for the implementation and delivery of the technical activities and outputs. The coordination and management procedures of the project will be detailed by an ad-hoc Project Management Guideline explaining the direct links between the work to be carried out during the work packages and the role of project partners based what decided in the partnership agreement. An internal monitoring will be constantly carried out in order to verify the performance of the management structure of the project. The Veneto Region as LB will coordinate the work of the Local Project Manager by appointing a Project Coordinator who will act as a driving force in the partnership mobilising the partners in order to achieve the objectives laid down in the project within the given time. The day-to-day management will be also facilitated through the Easy Connecting website where there will be a specific section dedicated to the project partners ensuring a continuous flow of information and data and a constant support to project partners.

The Veneto Region is a Public Authority whose legislative power is settled by the Italian Constitution. Its staff is composed of nearly 3000 employees. The Logistic Unit has one director, 3 senior functionaries, 3 administrative officers and 5 external consultants working mainly on EU projects management. The Logisti Unit is well equipped in terms of ICT and has the support of the main regional officie.

Description of previous (and current) experiences in CBC and international projects

The Logistic Unit of the Veneto Region has a very strong and long experience in transnational cooperation projects. It was the Lead Partner of the Project SONORA (Central Europe Programme: the project aimed at improving accessibility and multimodality in Central Europe from the Baltic to the Adriatic Sea) Alpcheck 2 (Alpine Space programme: the project aims at providing an innovative transport decision support tool for fostering sustainable and environmental friendly transport solutions in the Alpine Space) TranSafe-Alp (Alpine Space programme: the project aims at creating a software to manage safety and security operations in the Alpine Space Transport network). Furthermore the Logistic Unit was and is still partner of project: TRIM (Interreg IV Italia-Austria Programme), Adria-A(Italia-Slovenia), Watermode (SEE Programme), Transitects (Alpine Space), Poly 5 (Alpine Space) and to the strategic project RAILHUC (Central Europe Programme)

Contribution of the Beneficiary to the project

The Veneto Region is responsible for the overall management and coordination of the project and for the communication and dissemination activities (WP 1 and WP 2). Furthermore the Veneto Region will take part to all the other Working Packages by bringing all its expertise and experience in transport and logistic planning. In particular it will actively contribute to the Capitalization and Sustainability Plan and Strategy foreseen in WP3, it will contribute to the study and analyses of the demand and supply of freight transport services and to the Corridor Platform model of WP4, the Guidelines for the skills enhancement and to the organization of the ad-hoc seminars of WP5, and to the pilot project foreseen in WP7.

Competences, capacity and know how of the Beneficiary in implementing project activities and results

The Logistic Unit of the Veneto Region has a strong competence and capacity on planning and implementing transport and logistic policies in the Veneto Region. In particular the Logistic Unit has these specific competences:

- ¿ Regional Interventions for improving infrastructures and equipments in the transport sector and to support the shifting of freights from road to rail;
- ¿ Planning and programming investments on ports and retro-ports and logistic centres;
- ¿ Drafting of the Regional plan for the logistic sector;
- ¿ Setting up of a database gathering all the regional data on freight transport and a cartography of the regional transport context;
- ¿ Transnational and cross borders cooperation activities regarding freight transport and logistic operations.

The Logistic Unit is actively working on a new "Regional Logistic Agreement" involving all the regional key stakeholders (ports, interports, local authorities) to improve the mobility and distribution of freight across the Region.

The Ravenna Port Authority – according to the National Law 84/94 - has the task of allocating, planning, coordinating, promoting and controlling port operations and other commercial and industrial activities taking place in the port. The Port Authority also administers the State's maritime property, carrying out maintenance of the canal bed and infrastructure funded by the State and guaranteeing the ordinary and extraordinary maintenance of State property. The Ravenna Port Authority has 55 staff members. The organization is made up of 2 Departments (Technical and Operative) and some executive offices. The Technical Department – either directly or through external professionals - plans and manages the realization of infrastructural works whose annual total value exceeds on average 10/15 million euro. The revenues generated through port taxes by the Ravenna Port Authority, in the period covering 2010-2012, have on an annual basis exceeded the sum of 11 million euro.
